It is with great sadness that I report the death of John Murgatroyd. This tribute is from Bob Hatt.

I have known John and Vicky for 50 years as we met them shortly after coming to this village.

Over the years John did a huge amount for the



community, he was instrumental in getting the sports field and pavilion released from the Butler family, who owned the land. This ensured that these facilities could be used for village purposes in perpetuity.

He was involved with the fund raising and procurement of the village hall, also the village fête/show which was successful for so many years. He was greatly

involved with getting the affordable houses built on Heydon Road a few years ago.

John was a member and chairman of the Parish Council, he once told me that he thought his greatest achievement was persuading the Council to provide interval wine at the annual Parish meeting, something that the majority of residents wholeheartedly agreed with.

He was also one of the first members of the Great Chishill Wine Circle.

These were all worthy events, but his greatest asset was his personality. he was great fun to be with and always enjoyed company, those who knew him well will miss him, red wine in hand and a smile for everyone.
