### GRANTA MEDICAL PRACTICES APPOINTMENTS UPDATE

Here at Granta we continue to offer a mixture of face to face, telephone and online appointments.

Firstly, please be assured that no-one, apart from clinicians, makes clinical decisions about your care when you first contact us. Our reception teams have clear criteria, set by GPs, as to what can be put straight onto a clinician's urgent list. However, if there is any doubt, they will discuss your concerns with the clinical team and then get back to you.

When ringing for an appointment, please provide as much information as possible. All information is treated as confidential and will only be used for triage purposes. It helps to make sure you are seen by the right person, in the right place, at the right time.

Appointments can be telephone, or face to face, or one followed by the other.

Routine appointments are available a few weeks in advance, all pre-bookable via our reception teams and online. New routine appointments are released daily at 8 am and at 2 pm to allow for regular availability. If you ring and there is nothing available, reception can send you a link that is valid for 7 days (so you can check daily) to pre-book a face to face or telephone appointment, so that you do not need to ring back.

Alternatively, if you would prefer, you could use Accurx Patient Triage via our website to have an online consultation with a clinician. We do ask however that you only send routine queries as it can take up to 72 hours to respond.

On average, Granta's doctors and nurses see around 4,000 patients face to face per week, and consult with another 3,500 via the telephone and online. We try and accommodate all of our patients in a way that suits. Please be assured that we are continuously reviewing and revising patient access.

### **HELEN ABRAHAMS**

Congratulations to Great Chishill resident Dr Helen Abrahams (known professionally as Dr Helen Pain) who received an MBE in the King's 2024 New Year's Honours for services to Science!



This recognises her work with the Royal Society of Chemistry, where she is the Chief Executive, and the Science Council, where she was previously chair of the board of trustees. She has also chaired a number of advisory boards to support the role of technicians in higher education and research. This includes a UK-wide initiative

called the Technician Commitment and the recently established Institute for Technical Skills and Strategy, based at Nottingham University.

## SPECIAL INVITATION TO A SNOWDROP VIEWING

We are delighted to once again be able to offer an invitation to a private nature reserve to view snowdrops. We

have the opportunity for a limited number of people to view this 12-acre reserve on Saturday 10th February from 10 am to 3 pm. There are thousands of snowdrops, all planted by hand over a period of 30 years. This is a unique opportunity as the site is threatened by the East West rail link and may not be accessible in the near future.

This event was very popular last year, and the funds raised will

go towards the maintenance of The Great Chishill Windmill.

We plan to provide light refreshments as before or feel free to bring a picnic. Donations are requested.

The site is approximately 8 miles from Great Chishill located off the A10 between Foxton and Harston on the East side. The *what3word* code for the site entrance is *lifelong.rivals.issues*. The reserve is up a farm track and there will be a person in a Hi-Vis jacket at the entrance. It is safer to

approach the turning from the Harston direction where the entrance is on the left and easier to spot. Approaching from Foxton requires a right turn off the busy A10.

There is no need to book but it would be useful to know how many people are
