**From our County Councillor:
SUPERFAST BROADBAND**

To address the very poor broadband speeds in many rural areas, the county council has decided to borrow up to £20 million to invest in Superfast Broadband, which achieves speeds in excess of 25 Mbps.

The first step is to register your interest at <http://www.connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk/>. Information will be passed to commercial operators to see where they are prepared to provide the service commercially. If holes remain in the network then the county council can decide where to deploy its funding. This is very important in our part of the world, where a good proportion of people either run businesses or just work from home. So please sign up.

SPEEDWATCH IDEAS FOR GREAT CHISHILL

The Chishill Speedwatch team's request for action on persistent speeding has been conveyed to the county council. The relevant cabinet member has accepted Susan's invitation to meet the team to consider what might be done as a next step, in order to address the now well-documented and entrenched problem.

WHAT ABOUT NEW ROAD?

People have rightly pointed out that repairs to New Road have lasted only a short time, and have needed to be done all over again... and again, and again.

Road maintenance has been chronically underfunded, and the state of New Road is similar to that of roads all over South Cambs. The County Council reckons that in order to bring the county road and pavement network up to a decent standard, it would need to borrow about £500 million - something it can't afford to do. Over the next five years it will be borrowing £90 million for highways maintenance, and the hope is that gradually the network can be brought under better control than it is now. Funds spent on highways maintenance are divided into planned and reactive works. Reactive works like the ones to New Road are necessary because pot holes are obviously dangerous. Moreover, if the county doesn't make roads safe, it ends up paying more on insurance claims. Please let me know if you have any questions and I'll try to get them answered.

E - cops

A number of burglaries occurred on Monday 21st May which are being linked and involved the unusual method of impersonating police officers to gain entry to homes. In 4 cases either 3 or 4 white males, some dressed in what is described as police uniform with

the word 'police' displayed on outer jackets, entered homes claiming to be police and needing to search the property as part of on-going investigations. No identification was produced.

All the offences occurred between 1pm and 6pm. A black car was seen at 2 locations and it's likely that these persons visited other parts of the district and were travelling together.
