

Just a few miles away from Great Chishill, the Saturday morning 5km Parkrun event at Wimpole Estate is attended regularly by a number of villagers. Parkrun is not a race, but it is a timed event so you can try to better your previous times if you wish. You can



walk or run, and your results are emailed to you not long after the event is completed. As with all Parkruns, it's totally free, although non-members of the National Trust will

need to pay £2 for parking.

Wimpole runs two courses at different times of the year. The winter course is almost flat, but the summer course is very picturesque and features a steep climb at the 2km marker.
