GREAT CHISHILL BELL RESTORATION PROJECT

St. Swithun's has 5 bells which have been ringing out for hundreds of years - 4 of the bells were made in the middle of the 17th century so are 350 years old!

There have been times when they have been silent - during the wars, then for the 25 years from the 70's leading up to the Millennium when they fell into disrepair, and latterly due to the

pandemic.

The bells were made ringable again as a millennium project, but ever since then the ringers have been raising funds for a complete and total renovation. This will involve removing the bells from the tower and taking them to Oxford to have all their fixtures and fittings replaced. The wooden frame that the bells are mounted on, made in around 1650 from recycled timber, will need to be strengthened with new steel beams beneath it. That will be done at the same time. A new steel



framework will also be built to hang a brand new 6th bell, cast for us in July and generously donated by a local couple.

This whole project, costing close to £100,000, is due to start next



February. We have raised more than 1/3rd already. This project is separate from any funding done by the church. We are applying for grants, but we will need

donations and ideas for fund raising. There will be the opportunity to fix 20 memorial brass plaques to the headstocks of the 5 old bells. For lots more information and pictures visit greatchishill.org.uk and follow the links, or contact Phil Maynard on 838311.
