



An article in the Financial Times in December echoed some recent research about the benefits of faith and church.

Duxford Saturday Workshop

A very special Year

Duxford Saturday Workshop (DSW) was formally established in 1974 by Jill Steinberg, with the aim of promoting the performing arts to children and adults in the local community. This was something that was not easy to find then, and was not affordable to all. It is still the case that opportunities to learn and perform together in a friendly, encouraging environment are hard to come by. Workshop continues to offer this to all ages in an affordable way.

There are currently around 300 members, with all sessions/classes being run by volunteers (all tutors have a current DBS check). The Workshop also owns over 200 instruments which are available for hire.

The groups include a beginners' orchestra, an advanced orchestra and jazz bands, as well as a choir, ensembles for strings, recorders, guitars, ukuleles and wind instruments.

There are also two creative drama and music groups for children, a smaller group for KS1 children, and a larger music theatre group for children in KS2 & 3 from the age of 7.

Many members join Workshop to pick-up an instrument, whether as a beginner or with some previous experience, staying on to join an ensemble, group or orchestra. Indeed this is part of the underlying ethos of DSW – learning, friendship, support, encouragement, performance and enjoyment. Some members joined with their children and are still attending. I include myself here. Beginning as a novice guitarist with my son Sam many years ago, I am still there every Saturday morning during term time! It is now such a part of my life that I have withdrawal symptoms if I miss a session, and I now lead our Folk Guitar group. Being a part of DSW has given me the ability and confidence to sing and play with others, something that I would never have considered before I joined.

So 2024 is a special year for Workshop as we celebrate our 50th birthday! It is an important milestone for us as we contemplate what it is that has been provided to so many people over the years, and the

service that continues to be offered and welcomed. We look forward to the next 50 years.....

DSW takes place at Duxford Primary School each term time Saturday during the year from 09:30 to 12:30 over 3 sessions (you don't have to attend all 3 sessions). Hedge Planting at Strethall

There have been gaps in the hedge surrounding the churchyard at St Mary's for some time, so the decision was taken to infill these, either with yew or mixed hedging depending on the type already in place. The Woodland Trust kindly supplied the whips for the mixed hedge areas under their 'Free Trees for Communities' scheme. We are very grateful to have received a 'Wild Harvest' pack, which will hopefully provide some lovely blossom, fruits and hence food for wildlife in years to come! The DCC purchased yew plants to infill the gaps within the existing yew hedges.

On a chilly, beautifully sunny January morning, several members of the DCC plus other villagers enjoyed planting the whips and larger plants; we then put mesh around the smaller plants to prevent them being eaten by deer & rabbits! Fingers crossed for some good growing this year!



Espresso Divas

Gluttons – a rather aptly named café popular with those who love a good slice of cake with their coffee or a full breakfast/substantial (proper as my husband says) lunch...

The café is upstairs above shops in Saffron Walden at 13A King Street; not the easiest location for some but very worthwhile the effort. Its staircase and walls are covered in recognisable street and park scenes painted by local artists; many of which are for sale. There is a small, casual seating area as you arrive, followed by a more conventional layout of tables and chairs one step up.



The menu includes cooked breakfasts and lunches, sweet and savoury scones (a particular favourite of mine), and the most 'gluttonous' of cakes! The menu changes frequently and seems to have at least two 'specials' of the day alongside sure-fire classics; egg in every format, sausage, bacon, mushrooms and homemade bread/toast. Afternoon visitors have around eight types of homemade cake, (as well as the scones) to choose from. If you can't make up your mind the waiting staff can always try guiding you to a choice!

Open from 8.00am until 4.00pm Monday to Saturday, the place is busy and 'buzzy ; especially at lunch times. If you decide to wait for a table you can always view and discuss the art work. Market days (Tuesday and Saturday) are worth booking but out of the 12 - 1.30 timeframe you can usually get a table.


