

Espresso Divas

The Mixing Shed Café at Compass Courtyard

You may have seen signs for Compass Courtyard on your way to Saffron Walden – and if you haven't ventured in yet, you could be missing a treat. It can be found on the B1039 on the way to Saffron Walden, just past the turn off to Littlebury. It is clearly signposted from both directions with an entrance you would be hard pressed not to see. The collection of repurposed and new farm buildings play host to a number of businesses, including The Loaf Tin Bakery, A F Fitness Training, Lily Bay Beauty, Julies Cookery Academy and Catering Company and The Wightman Gallery & Pottery Studio. All are in beautifully appointed barns set in the old farmyard.

Compass Café is situated in one of the larger barns with stunning views across open fields. It has both indoor and outdoor seating and is open Tuesday to Saturday 8am – 4pm and Sundays 9.00am– 3.00pm. The Café serves barista coffee alongside teas and cold drinks and a delicious selection of pastries and cakes. There is a Breakfast and Lunch menu



too – all freshly prepared and cooked in the kitchens.

Placing your order at the counter can be difficult – but only because of the selection to choose from! However, I am a confirmed cappuccino and pastry addict and can report that the coffee is served hot in the usual variations and is a well flavoured blend; the pastries are delicious.

An Enduring Gift

The Will of Rebecca Perry and John Fiske Wilkes

In the parish we are beneficiaries of the philanthropic kindness of several local people who have left bequests in their wills for the benefit of local people.

Rebecca Perry (1790-1875), an independent lady, farming 9 acres in Strethall and 23 acres with Poplar Farm (originally Elmdon), generously made provision for a trust to be established upon her death. Her trust has been carefully managed over the ensuing years, the original sum bequeathed continues to help local people.

John Fiske Wilkes was the local squire 200 years ago and he had similar ideas about providing for people less fortunate than he was in this Parish. His bequest and Rebecca Perry's are now combined for the future.

The trustees seek to fulfil their wishes to relieve generally or individually persons resident in the parish who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress by making grants of money or providing or paying for items, services or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons.

The trustees are conscious of the pressure on all households today. Applications for support from this trust, for example for school uniform up to ± 200 , towards power bills or the cost of living should be made in confidence to :

Penelope Gaine

We are sad to report the death, in February, of Penelope Gaine. Penelope left a career in publishing with Wiedenfeld & Nicholson when she and Michael married in 1971 and they then moved to Elmdon in 1972, first into Pump Cottage and then into Crawley House. From the start, Penelope embraced life in the community; she was an active member of our Church serving on the PCC for many years, as well as participating in many aspects of life in Elmdon. She served on the Parish Council and was ultimately elected Chairman. She was a



reading assistant at Chrishall School. She was also a Magistrate sitting in Saffron Walden (until the Court closed) and then in Harlow and Chelmsford.

She wrote four books, worked as PA to the Moore family at The Henry Moore Foundation, ran a successful small business and was active with several charities. She was a wonderful cook and hostess (someone locally, without her knowledge, entered her for MasterChef when it first started in 1990). The focus of her life were her family and friends but beyond that she liked nothing more than to travel which she and Michael did extensively. She loved being at their house in Haut de Cagnes on the Côte d'Azur and entertaining friends there.

She showed signs of becoming ill in 2009 and her health started to deteriorate badly in 2017. Penelope's death is a reminder to us all of what a cruel disease vascular dementia is.

Three hundred people attended a Requiem Mass which was held for her at The Catholic Church of St. Theresa of Lisieux on 21st March and her mortal remains were cremated at Cam Valley Crematorium the next day. Her ashes will be interred in Elmdon Churchyard in May. We offer our condolences to Michael as well as to her sons, David and Daniel.
