#### TRISTRAM'S TRAVELS

Tristram Alexander, of Hope Cottages, is planning an incredible solo road trip, expected to last 2 to 3 years! He will travel around 200,000 miles, mainly off-road on gravel tracks, around North and South America. He will be riding a specially built motorbike. It is robust, capable of on or off road use and



Tristram has christened it Goliath. It has a range of roughly 400 miles using three buit-in fuel tanks.

Tristram leaves Great Chishill on 28th February to fly to Miami, where the trip will start. He will travel up the East side of the USA, to Canada, then across to Vancouver, then up to Alaska, then back down the West side of the Rockies, into Mexico and all the

way round South America, back up through the States to Lake Superior, across to New England, and finally, by 2024 or 2025, back to Miami. On the way he is including a two-week break (without the bike) to visit the Galapagos. While in the Chilean Andes, he plans to visit the highest Observatory in the world at 5,500 m above sea level. He also plans to travel by boat (with his bike) from Manaus in Brazil to the headwaters of the Amazon in Peru. There he will rejoin the road network.

He will be travelling alone with all his requirements carried on his person and on his bike. In a thigh pack he has a search and rescue communication device, a high powered laser beacon, a comprehensive first-aid kit with sterile needles, a tourniquet and canulas. He will also have three sets of satellite navigation systems including one in his helmet, and he will be monitored by a GPS system which will track his

movements. If people are interested, they can follow his trip by going to his Instagram account (tristram84).

He will have a tent with him, but occasionally he will stay in hostels and once every three months during this 2 to 3 year trip he plans to stay in a five star hotel for 1 to 2 nights to recharge his batteries. I will try and report his progress in this newsletter every two or three months.
