AED – Automatic Emergency Defibrillator

Although the village has had an AED for some time now, situated in a yellow box on the outside wall of the village hall, many of you may not be sure how to access it or use it. Here is a reminder. In an emergency, the first

thing you do is dial 999. If the operator decides it is a Cat 1 or Cat 2 emergency they will give you a code which can be used to open the yellow storage box. You will have to go and get the AED (or send someone to fetch it for you). The code needs to be entered on the key pad in order to open the box. Once you have the AED with the patient the 999 operator will tell you how it should be used.

HOW OUR NAMES HAVE CHANGED

In the Doomsday Book our village was referred to as Cishella, which means "gravelly hill". Moving forward several centuries we find a 1676 map showing Cheshill Magna (Great Chishill) and Cheshill Parva (Little Chishill), both in the County of Essex.



By Victorian times the village name had been formalised to Great Chishall ('hall' not 'hill'). Many different gazetteers and trade directories used this spelling.

Great Chishall remained part of Essex until 1895, when it was transferred to Cambridgeshire, although the parish of St Swithun's remained part of the diocese of Chelmsford. In 1929 the parish name was changed from "Great Chishall" to "Great Chishill", and then in 1968 the parish was abolished to form "Great and Little Chishill". Our village is now part of Essex for worship, part of Cambridgeshire for local government services, and part of Hertfordshire by postcode. Only in England!
